The profession has a professional body representative of over 90% of the profession	
Detailed comments	
The Institute of Maxillofacial Prosthetists and Technologists is a professional body representative of over 90% of the profession. Apart from 4 MPT's working in the armed forces, all MPT's work within the NHS.	
It is estimated that there are 22 MPT practitioners not currently registered with the IMPT. The units employing these practitioners were all contacted and informed about regulation. Their views however are not recorded in the application documentation.	
The Association of Maxillofacial Technicians was formed in 1958. In 1969, the AMFT changed its name to the IMFT and in 1997 changed to the present name IMPT.	
A constitution for the profession was formalised in 1958. The original basis of the constitution is the aims and objectives of the IMPT while the constitution itself is the Registered Articles of Association.	
The IMPT became a company in 1989 under the companies act 1985.	
The profession has election rules in place and has provided evidence of ballot papers and nomination forms.	
No evidence of election results is included in the application.	
Minutes of 3 council meeting are included in the full application	
The profession has grand parenting/transitional arrangements in place
