Decision
That the programme has been subject to major change and that an approval visit is required to determine how the programme continues to meet the standards for prescribing considering the introduction of the new profession to the programme.
Reasons
<p>The panel agreed that a visit was required to review the issues raised in the major change visitors' report. Owing to the nature of issues highlighted by the visitors, the panel stated that a visit must be undertaken in order to ensure that the programme is compliant with the prescribing standards. The visit should be scheduled along a 4-5 month notification period following this decision.</p> <p>The visit should consider whether all prescribing standards continue to be met considering the introduction of dietitians to the programme.</p> <p>The visit should be formed of meetings with the senior team, programme team, practice placement staff and students, with a tour of the resources for the programme, and a full set of documentation should be provided.</p>
